

# Space Heaters Can Dramatically Increase your Electric Bill

Use the formula below to determine what the monthly cost of operating a space heater will be before you plug it in.

#### Example for a 1,500 watt space heater:

(wattage divided by 1,000) x hours used x cost per kWh = cost per day

Example: (1,500 watts ÷ 1,000) x 24 hours x 9.69¢ (REA's general service rate) = \$3.49 per day

To calculate a monthly cost multiply your cost per day by number of days in the month.

\$3.49 x 30 days = \$104.70. This is your cost per month. Bottom line: space heaters are convenient, but expensive to use!

Audrey Hjelle, who sits on the REA Board and also serves as secretary for Great River Energy's Board (REA's power supplier), was chosen to receive the Cooperative Network Builder Award. This award recognizes her outstanding contributions to advance cooperative philosophy and ideals.

Audrey was nominated for this award for her dedication to furthering the mission of electric cooperatives over the last three decades. Her experience as a cooperative member since 1963 provides a
